- The Maybank Group Sustainable Product Framework (SPF) 2023 & 2024 provides the classification logic for the recognition of our sustainable finance achievement under Section 3.0 (which excludes Asset Management and Wealth Management) and is broken down into four parameters covering dedicated financing and general purpose financing. Classification logics for Asset Management and Wealth Management as well as Insurance is disclosed separately under Sections 4.0 and 5.0 respectively.
- Mobilisation via advisory refers to deals where Maybank performs the role of a sustainability structuring advisor which serves as a critical component to the overall transaction. This role typically involves advising/reviewing/finalising the client's sustainability framework coordinating/liaising with the Second Party Opinion provider (SPO), advising on the appropriate disclosures in line with market standards and investor expectations, amongst others. In cases where Maybank plays the role of both the advisor and underwriter/lender to a given transaction, we will recognise the higher proportioned amount attributable to either role. The recognition for advisory roles is contingent on the scope of work clearly being defined and critical to the overall transaction and appropriately supported.
- Mobilisation by Global Markets is aligned to the SPF Classification Logic shown under Section 3.0 of the SPF 2024, and includes mobilisation via Principles (RM313.37 million) and Use of Proceeds (RM201.11 million).
- Mobilisation of sustainable finance in Insurance is undertaken by our Insurance arm, Etiqa. This currently only includes mobilisation via fixed income investments (recognised under Parameter 1: Principles), which is aligned to Section 5.0 of the SPF 2024. Recognition of sustainable finance mobilisation via insurance underwriting will begin in 2025.
- Classification Logic for Asset Management can be found in Section 4.0 of SPF 2023 and SPF 2024 respectively. Under SPF 2024 (which is effective from 1 October 2024), the amount recognisable as sustainable finance for Asset Management has been updated to be based on the the new fund sales of qualifying funds per the classification logic shown under Section 4.0. Consequently, the Low Risk Scoring Methodology introduced under the classification logic in SPF2023 has been removed. For the period of October - December 2024, this new approach of new fund sales for Asset Management brought in RM54.8 million in sustainable finance mobilisation.
